Careful patient assessment is an important part of the casting process. This at-a-glance guide takes you through the key questions you need to ask before applying the cast.

	<ul> <li>Which bony areas will need extra padding?</li> <li>Where are the blood vessels or nerves that are close to the surface and may be compromised?</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Is swelling expected?</li> <li>Is the cast to be weight-bearing?</li> <li>Assess the number of staff required to safely hold the patient's limb and apply the cast</li> </ul>
